**Upcoming Telework Exchange Fall Town Hall Meeting to Take IT Home;
Virginia Transportation Secretary to Keynote**

*October 18 Event Focuses on Technology and Management Needs to Meet the
Telework Enhancement Act of 2010 Requirements*

ALEXANDRIA, Va., September 13, 2011 – Telework Exchange, a public-private partnership focused on promoting telework across government, today announced the program details for the upcoming [Fall 2011 Town Hall Meeting](#) on Tuesday, Oct. 18, 2011, at the Ronald Reagan Building and International Trade Center in Washington, D.C. The 10th semi-annual event will feature an all-day conference to examine best practices and solutions to help government agencies successfully “Take IT Home” and meet the requirements of the [Telework Enhancement Act of 2010](#) (Public Law 111-292). The event will feature Sean T. Connaughton, secretary of transportation for the Commonwealth of Virginia, as the morning keynote speaker.

The Fall Town Hall Meeting is expected to bring together more than 900 attendees – with the majority representing the Federal government. Themed “Take IT Home,” this all-day event and exhibit will feature more than 30 government and industry speakers. Kicking off the event as the morning keynote is Virginia secretary of transportation Sean T. Connaughton. He serves in the cabinet of Governor Bob McDonnell and oversees seven state agencies with more than 9,700 employees and combined annual budgets of \$5 billion.

“I am delighted to be a part of the Fall Town Hall Meeting to discuss how telework supports the Commonwealth’s transportation goals. As Virginia’s secretary of transportation, I am very much aware of the ever-increasing costs of congestion and fixing our transportation challenges,” said

Secretary Connaughton. “We must encourage telework as a cost-effective way to mitigate traffic issues for Virginia’s commuters.”

Throughout the day, speakers will address telework program essentials including security, cloud computing, collaboration, building management buy-in, managing a mobile workforce, and implementing and evaluating successful pilot programs. View the full program [here](#).
